How to get to Chertsey Museum

By car

Chertsey Museum is reached from the M25 (Junction 11), A320 from Staines or Woking/Guildford and B375 from Kingston.

There is street parking (you could try nearby Staines Lane, Alwyns Lane or Grove Road) or the town centre car parks are about 5 minutes walk from the museum.

- Library Car Park, Heriot Road KT16 9DR is £7 for all day
- Beomonds, Heriot Road KT16 9BU is £5.50 for 6 hours

(You can use cash pay and display or Ringo at both these car parks)

By train

Trains from Waterloo to Chertsey via Staines or Weybridge, then a 10 minute walk to the Museum.

Lunch

You are welcome to bring a packed lunch to eat in the room; and tea and coffee will be available. The museum is about 5-10 minute walk from Chertsey town centre with its shops and takeaways.
