This Autumn conference, held once again with the support of SCC Heritage Conservation Team, continues the Research Framework process. Following the 2001 Conference *Archaeology in Surrey in the 21st century* and the subsequent publication of *Aspects of Archaeology and History in Surrey in 2004*, the Surrey Research Framework was launched in 2006. Since then, the framework has been used as a basis for the development of further research into many topics.

This year's conference follows the evolution of Parks and Gardens in England, starting with an examination of the physical remains in today's landscape before looking to documentary research to illuminate the social factors which drove changes in fashion over time, finishing with current work on restoration of an important Surrey garden. Attendance is limited to 120 and therefore pre-booking is strongly advised.
